STRATEGIC SHIFTS & BOLD CONVERSATIONS:

EASTERN CAPE HOSTS HIGH-IMPACT AUTOMOTIVE ROUNDTABLE

Before the buzz of the NAACAM Show 2025, the Eastern Cape Provincial Government, in partnership with the East London Industrial Development Zone (ELIDZ), proudly hosted the NAAMSA Thought Leadership Roundtable.





Held at the ELIDZ Conference Centre, the event set the tone for the automotive industry engagements, bringing together government, industry, and business leaders for a day of deep reflection and bold thinking.

Under the theme "South African Inc. Amidst Geopolitical Tensions – The Automotive Sector Case Study," the Roundtable explored how South Africa's automotive industry can remain globally competitive while navigating the evolving realities of international trade and geopolitics.

ELIDZ Board Chairperson, Mr. Motse Mfuleni, opened the session by positioning the zone as a strategic enabler of industrial transformation. He spoke about the importance of building resilient ecosystems that not only sustain growth but also advance inclusivity and innovation.

MEC Nonkqubela Pieters, representing the Eastern Cape Department of Economic Development, Environmental Affairs and Tourism (DEDEAT), provided an overview of the province's strategic response to the recent US tariffs affecting local OEMs and suppliers. Her remarks highlighted the need for proactive adaptation, emphasizing the importance of strengthening localisation, fostering innovation, and diversifying exports to secure the future of the province's automotive industry.

A lot was said on the day — and one of the most defining contributions came from NAAMSA President, Mr. Billy Tom, who contextualised the global shifts confronting South Africa's automotive sector. Reflecting on the "Liberation Day" and Section 232 tariffs imposed by the United States, he cautioned that the privileges of global trade can no longer be taken for granted.

"For decades, our industry has relied on AGOA to provide duty-free access to US markets, an arrangement that not only underpinned export growth but also supported thousands of South African jobs. That foundation has now been shaken," he noted.

He further highlighted the need for policy coherence, intra-African trade, and regional integration under the AfCFTA, arguing that the sector's survival depends on its ability to balance global partnerships with domestic self-reliance.

"This conversation is not only about numbers or tariffs," he added. "It is about sovereignty, resilience, and the ability of South Africa's automotive sector to withstand shocks while reimagining its place in the global trade architecture."

The Female Leadership Panel offered an equally compelling perspective, reminding delegates that leadership in uncertain times requires empathy, inclusivity, and long-term vision. Drawing from their experiences across industry, government, and enterprise development, the panelists highlighted how women leaders continue to redefine transformation in practice.

The Roundtable also drew participation from OEM CEOs and senior executives, whose insights grounded the discussion in the operational realities of the automotive value chain.

By the end of the session, one sentiment resonated clearly — the Eastern Cape is not only South Africa's automotive powerhouse of today, but also a key driver of its industrial future.

Through this high-impact dialogue, the ELIDZ once again affirmed its role as a trusted partner of thought leadership — fostering collaboration, shaping strategic direction, and driving conversations that position the province at the forefront of South Africa's automotive transformation.

SA AUTO WEEK 2025: DRIVING THE EASTERN CAPE'S AUTOMOTIVE FUTURE

The Eastern Cape was buzzing with energy as SA Auto Week 2025 kicked off, bringing together government, industry, and investment partners to shape the future of South Africa's automotive sector. For three days, the province showcased why it's more than just an automotive hub—it's a place where innovation, collaboration, and growth converge.

At the Premier's Investment Breakfast, MEC Nonkqubela Pieters described the Eastern Cape as South Africa's "Detroit," highlighting its SEZs and IDZs as engines of industrialisation, job creation, and trade. Industry leaders echoed her message, stressing that sustainable growth depends on strong partnerships between government and businesses, improvements to infrastructure, a more enabling regulatory environment, and support for local procurement. Bridging these gaps, they agreed, is essential to building resilience and attracting investment.

A highlight of the week was the "Developing the Southern Corridor – Unlocking Logistics for OEM Growth" panel featuring our esteemed CEO, Tembela Zweni. He shared his vision for auto-logistics as a catalyst for growth, explaining how cost-effective, reliable, and secure logistics can enhance the Eastern Cape's competitiveness, boost exports, and create jobs.

He emphasised the need to strengthen all linkages between infrastructure and production,

highlighting how integrated logistics systems, efficient transport networks, and enabling industrial infrastructure are essential to unlocking manufacturing potential and driving economic growth. He further stressed that government must be intentional and take bold decisions to position the Eastern Cape as a globally competitive industrial hub.

In an exclusive SA FM interview, Mr. Zweni spoke passionately about how ELIDZ is building resilience in the Eastern Cape economy, attracting investment, creating jobs, and supporting transformative initiatives across the province.

Minister of Trade, Industry and Competition, Parks Tau, reminded attendees that the automotive sector is a cornerstone of the economy, but warned that South Africa risks losing key export markets if it does not embrace new energy vehicles (NEVs). He emphasised the importance of policy and incentive certainty, modernised logistics and infrastructure, and strong public-private

partnerships to unlock growth. His message was clear — innovation, collaboration, and agility are essential for the sector's future.

The week concluded by celebrating leadership in the sector. DEDEAT Head of Department, Micky Mama, was honoured at the prestigious 2025 naamsa accelerator Awards, as the Value Creator of the Year for her outstanding contributions to the automotive industry. Her recognition reflects her commitment to innovation, partnership, and advancing the Eastern Cape's role in South Africa's automotive landscape.

SA Auto Week 2025 captured a simple but powerful truth — the Eastern Cape has the talent, infrastructure, and potential to lead South Africa's automotive future, but partnership is key. With ELIDZ driving innovation, government enabling growth, and industry investing in the future, the province is ready to reimagine mobility, unlock new opportunities, and create lasting impact.

The delegation toured RG Brose and Vehicle Delivery Services (VDS), observing the full automotive value chain from component manufacturing to vehicle delivery highlighting how the ELIDZ serves as a critical industrial engine for the province. Eastern Cape Innovation Challenge 2025 – Turning Ideas into Impact

The Eastern Cape Innovation Challenge 2025, launched in partnership with Technology Innovation Agency (TIA) and supported by the UNDP, invites innovators to present technology-driven solutions addressing the province's pressing socio-economic challenges.

The Challenge emphasizes sector diversity, including:

- Agriculture & Aquaculture
- Automotive
- ICT & Electronics
- Renewable Energy
- Manufacturing

Participants stand to win up to R100,000 per sector, receive mentorship, prototyping support, and guidance on intellectual property, and gain access to networks and training programmes that enhance their ability to translate ideas into scalable, sustainable solutions.

Due to overwhelming interest, the closing date has been extended to 17 October 2025, allowing even more young innovators, entrepreneurs, and creative thinkers to seize this opportunity to shape the Eastern Cape's innovation landscape.

Digital Skills Development *in Maletswai*

Continuing its mandate to prepare youth for the future of work, the STP, in partnership with Walter Sisulu Municipality and Ikhala TVET College, hosted a Gaming Development & Animation and Computer-Aided Design (CAD) & Additive Manufacturing (3D Printing) training workshop in Maletswai (formerly Aliwal North).

This initiative targeted unemployed youth, students, and SMMEs, equipping them with highly relevant digital skills that enhance employability and entrepreneurial potential. Participants who successfully complete the programme receive certificates, formalizing their competencies and enabling them to enter technology-driven industries with confidence.

The workshop highlighted future-ready skills development, bridging the gap between education, industry needs, and emerging sectors, ensuring that participants can actively contribute to innovation-led economic growth across the Eastern Cape.



Certified Online Training Courses – *Learning* Anytime, Anywhere

To complement hands-on workshops, the ELIDZ-STP, as a CISCO Network Academy partner, is offering free, self-paced online courses to participants from across the Eastern Cape. These courses are designed to build critical digital skills that are highly sought after in the 21st-century economy.

EASTERN CAPE: A CALL FOR COMMUNITY-CENTRED CLIMATE RESILIENCE

The recent devastating storm that struck the Eastern Cape, particularly around Mthatha, claimed nearly 90 lives and severely damaged infrastructure. This tragedy underscores the province's growing exposure to climate-related risks and highlights the urgent need to strengthen our collective preparedness for extreme weather events.

South Africa benefits from world-class forecasting capabilities through the South African Weather Service. However, a critical challenge remains; ensuring that this valuable information translates into timely, effective action at the community level. Bridging this gap is essential to building climate-resilient communities in the Eastern Cape, and it begins with data.

Communities across the Eastern Cape are often the first to experience the impacts of extreme weather, yet many remain underprepared. This is not due to a lack of will, but often due to communication barriers, limited resources, and a lack of accessible, actionable information. In rural municipalities, these challenges are often compounded by infrastructure constraints.

A key issue is the limited availability of consistent, ground-level weather data. Accurate forecasting depends on real-time, localised data, yet many parts of the Eastern Cape lack sufficient weather monitoring infrastructure. This is where regional data centres, such as the East London Industrial Development Zone (ELIDZ) Data Centre, can play a transformative role as a vehicle for aggregating and analysing localised data to support early warning systems and disaster response planning.

To address this challenge of climate change and its associated consequences, the Eastern Cape can benefit from a more community-centred weather information ecosystem. Empowering citizens to participate in weather observation and climate education can enhance both data quality and public awareness.

Mobile network coverage and smartphone usage are increasingly widespread, even in rural areas. This presents an opportunity to integrate traditional knowledge—such as interpreting wind patterns and cloud formations—with modern forecasting tools. Schools, in particular, can serve as vital hubs for this initiative. By equipping them with basic weather labs and distributing tools like rain gauges to households, these initiatives can help foster a culture of climate awareness and grassroots participation. The ELIDZ Data Centre can serve

as a central repository for this citizen-generated data, enabling real-time analysis and feedback loops that empower communities to act swiftly and confidently in the face of climate threats.

For community engagement to be effective, digital inclusion must be prioritised. Expanding mobile and internet connectivity in underserved areas of the Eastern Cape is not only a development imperative, but also a climate change adaptation strategy.

Improved connectivity enables real-time alerts, community reporting, and access to educational content on weather patterns and risks. Informed and connected communities are more likely to take proactive measures when faced with imminent threats.

The ELIDZ Data Centre, with its advanced digital infrastructure, is well-positioned to support this connectivity drive. By acting as a regional digital backbone, it can facilitate the flow of climate information between national systems and local communities, ensuring inclusivity for all in the Eastern Cape.

While there have been calls to decentralise weather forecasting, it is important to recognise that this is a highly technical and resource-intensive function. Rather than full devolution, a more effective approach is regional empowerment within a unified national system.

The South African Weather Service should remain the central authority but can enhance its impact by establishing regional collaboration hubs hosted at universities, science centres, or innovation zones. These hubs can work closely with municipalities, schools, and civil society to ensure that forecasting and outreach efforts are locally relevant while maintaining scientific integrity and national coordination.

The private sector also has a valuable role to play. International examples, such as IBM's Weather Company, demonstrate how commercial innovation can enhance weather data collection and dissemination. In the Eastern Cape, partnerships and incentives can



be explored to support community-based data initiatives, particularly in areas with limited public resources.

The ELIDZ Data Centre offers a platform for such collaboration. It provides secure, scalable infrastructure where public and private stakeholders can co-develop solutions, pilot technologies, and share insights that benefit the broader region.

Reliable, accessible climate data is essential for informed decision-making. The ELIDZ has established a state-of-the-art data centre tailored to the province's needs. This facility is more than a storage site. It is a strategic enabler of climate resilience.

By hosting regional weather and climate data, the data centre would support proactive planning, disaster mitigation, and long-term adaptation strategies. It would also provide a secure environment for researchers, policymakers, and emergency services to access and analyse data in real time, enhancing coordination and response across the Eastern Cape.

The climate crisis is no longer a distant threat. It is a present reality, especially for vulnerable communities in the Eastern Cape. To protect our people, we must go beyond technical forecasting and invest in inclusive, community-driven climate resilience.

By strengthening infrastructure, recognising indigenous knowledge, fostering public participation, and building regional capacity within a national framework, South Africa can transform vulnerability into resilience. The ELIDZ Data Centre stands as a beacon of this transformation, demonstrating how digital innovation can support environmental stewardship and community empowerment in the province.


